

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ELECTRONIC TRANSFER OF MARKETABLE SECURITIES STOCKS, BONDS AND MUTUAL FUNDS

Important: for transfer of non-marketable securities or paper stock certificates, please contact the Coalition's Resource Development Office

Depository Trust Company (DTC) is a central securities repository where marketable securities are exchanged. The DTC is a member of the Federal Reserve System.

Be sure to include the number and type of shares, expected transfer date, purpose and any other relevant information. If you are working with a Coalition development officer, feel free to copy them on your message. Thank you.

Please Note: for tax purposes, the Gift Date is recognized as the date the shares enter the Colorado Coalition for the Homeless' clearing account at Charles Schwab brokerage. The gift will be valued on the average price (the mean between the highest and lowest selling prices) of the stock on the date received.
