



Located on 560 acres in unincorporated Arapahoe County, the Sage Ridge Supportive Residential Community is a Denver Metro Area campus that welcomes individuals from across the state who are experiencing homelessness and seeking addiction recovery support. Individuals may stay for up to two years of transitional housing recovery on a voluntary basis. Sage Ridge is place of restoration and a supportive environment where individuals are met with compassion, respect, and the resources they need to grow, stabilize, and reconnect with their chosen communities. At full capacity in 2026, the Sage Ridge Supportive Residential Community will support 192 individuals at a time.

THE SAGE RIDGE MODEL

Sage Ridge is modeled after the Coalition's Fort Lyon Supportive Residential Community, which has served thousands of Coloradans for over a decade through a trauma-informed transitional housing recovery model with wraparound services. Participants receive integrated healthcare, vocational training, case management, community programs, and peer-supported staffing that fosters autonomy and self-care.

Through this integrated approach, residents have the ability to recover from substance use disorders as well as homelessness with long-term housing stability and reintegration into their community of choice being the ultimate goals for all participants. The Coalition also operates an on-site health center with expertise in the specific needs of participants, as part of the CCH integrated health model.

A separate provider offers detox beds on campus, allowing residents who relapse or are struggling with sobriety to stabilize on-site and return to the recovery program side when ready.



A CAMPUS WITH A NEW PURPOSE

Sage Ridge was made possible by the passage of House Bill 1377, passed in 2022. This bill prioritized recovery care for people experiencing homelessness. As a result, the former Ridge View Youth Services Center was transferred from the Colorado Department of Human Services to the Department of Personnel Administration for use by the Colorado Department of Local Affairs (DOLA), who then selected the Coalition to be the operating on-site partner.

WHAT'S NEXT FOR SAGE RIDGE?

Sage Ridge is a peer-led community, with many elements created by and for those receiving services.

While there are set parts of the journey such as our programmatic curriculum or required campus-wide meetings, much of the heart of Sage Ridge is still being developed by the new residents, many of whom transferred to Sage Ridge from Fort Lyon. Residents are key leaders in shaping the model, as their lived experience of recovery is a critical piece of supporting others.
